22 23 24	WHEREAS the Assembly must ensure that it is able to operate effectively and efficiently;
25 26 27	WHEREAS the current bylaws do not clearly state requirements for times and deadlines for submitting meeting materials;
28 29 30 31	BELIEVING STRONGLY that all documents should be submitted to the President of the Assembly in due time, so that said documents can be shared with members of the Assembly;
32 33 34	THERERFORE BE IT ENACTED by the Graduate and Professional Student Assembly the following amendments to the bylaws:
35 36	AMENDS Title I, Article 1, Section F of the GPSA Bylaws to say the following:
37 38 39 40 41 42 43	"Executive Officers must attend all Assembly meetings (including special sessions). Executive officers are required, at this time, to verbally present a report to the Assembly and answer questions arising from such. Executive Officers are also required to submit written reports to the Assembly for each Assembly meeting. The submission deadline for written reports shall be set by the Assembly in accordance with these bylaws. Executive Officers must be available throughout the entire meeting to answer questions."
44 45 46	ADDS the following section to the Bylaws, which shall be Title II, Article 5; unless there is no Title II, Article 4, upon which this added section shall be Title II, Article 4:

"Miscellaneous Powers and Requ	uirements of the Assembly
--------------------------------	---------------------------

- A. The Assembly shall set, through adoption of a standing rule, a submission deadline for any and all written materials to be presented during an Assembly meeting, including but not exclusively written reports from Executive Officers and Committees, and Assembly Bills.
 - a. The Assembly may pursue sanctions against those who are required to submit written materials, but do not submit them, or submit them late."
