- **Associated Students of ASU Presidents Council**

The Presidents Council hosted open student forums with Dr. Crow on October 10 – each campus was linked via video-audio feed to providing an interactive setting for students to ask Dr. Crow questions. Dr. Crow spoke from the Tempe campus for this forum. Three more forums will be held throughout the year with the other campuses each hosting Dr. Crow.

At the September ABOR meeting, the Presidents Council learned about a challenge with the student funded facility projects moving forward on schedule. Although the projects passed approval with students, ASU administrators and ABOR, the projects were not scheduled for the JCCR agenda at the State Legislature which is a necessary step for all capital projects. GPSA led efforts in developing speaking points, an outline for telephone calls to Legislators, and sent an email address to all members of the JCCR requesting that projects for the Polytechnic and West campuses be reviewed as soon as possible. Additionally, several student leaders met in person with many Legislators to educate them on the importance of these projects to ASU students.

The Presidents Council has been working closely with Arizona Students' Association (ASA) Directors at ASU to create a series of documents that redefine expectations for ASA; the documents will be forwarded this month to the ASA Board of Directors for consideration.

- **Arizona Board of Regents**

The September ABOR meeting was held at Northern Arizona University. President Grossman of the Undergraduate Student Government at ASU's Downtown Phoenix campus addressed ABOR during the call to the audience regarding disparity funding issues at the State level for all three Arizona universities.
